Position Summary

We seek to contract an experienced Technical Writer to complete a series of aircraft identification panels and artefact labels between May and July 2021. This contract is based on 300 hours of work and includes writing, research, editing, and documentation of source materials.

The Technical Writer will work under the direction of the Museum's Curator and is expected to demonstrate advanced knowledge of the aviation industry in Canada, especially the technological history of bush planes.

Qualified applicants will be asked to participate in a writing test to evaluate their ability to write in an engaging, plain language style for a broad general audience. The Museum will supply text standards and references.

The chosen candidate will be required to provide their own computer and will be expected to work remotely.
