The Royal Aviation Museum of Western Canada (RAMWC) has completed construction of an 86,000 sq. ft facility location on the James A. Richardson International Airport campus in Winnipeg, Manitoba and is now open to the public. The Museum is a non-profit dedicated to preserving the history of aviation in Western Canada. The new Museum will showcase 27 aircraft and many unique aviation artefacts from its collection, presented from a story-driven approach.

The new home of the Royal Aviation Museum of Western Canada is located on Treaty 1 territory, the traditional territory of Anishinaabeg, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota, Lakota and Dene Peoples, and the homeland of the Métis Nation.

The Role

Reporting to the Programs Director, the Children's Programs Coordinator will deliver pre-booked museum developed children programs and tours school groups, day cares and other child focused groups targeting children and students from Pre-K to Grade 12. Programs are two hours in length (60 minute program & 60 minute tour). The incumbent also oversees the successful delivery of programming by School Program Interpreters lead by staff and volunteers.
